The **regular meeting** of the Vanceburg City Council was held on **August 1, 2022**, and presided over by Mayor, Dane Blankenship.

Pledge of Allegiance by all and Prayer gave by Councilman Jahn.

Councilman Lodge made a motion to suspend and approve the **minutes** of the **regular meeting** held on **August 1, 2022**. Councilwoman Pugh seconded the motion.

New Business:

1<sup>st</sup> reading of Ordinance #540.25B, No Parking on Chestnut Street. The ordinance was not read. Councilman Lodge stated he thought the temporary parking needed to be taken out of the presented ordinance. Councilman Jahn stated he had spoken with residents who live on Chestnut Street that is not in favor of the ordinance. He asked if the current ordinance could be enforced more than it has been. The current ordinance reads that a vehicle cannot be parked within 15 feet of a driveway. Chief Billman said after the meeting himself and Officer Gilbert would go out and measure a vehicle that has been an issue on the street to see how it measures within the surrounding driveways.

After some discussion Councilman Lodge made a motion to **table** the **1<sup>st</sup> reading** of **Ordinance #540.25B, No Parking on Chestnut Street** until next meeting. Councilwoman Pugh seconded the motion.

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Attorney Erin Hall read the 1<sup>st</sup> reading of Ordinance #410.05F, Permit the Sale of Alcoholic Beverages on Sundays. Donna Polley with Polley's Carry Out was in attendance and she spoke saying Polley's Carry Out was not in favor of this ordinance. Councilman Jahn stated he would like the choice to be able to have the option to open for Sunday Sales of Alcohol. The license fee for Sunday sales was discussed saying the city would like to help businesses not to charge them for the sale of alcohol on Sundays.

After much discussion Councilwoman Patton made a motion to **amend the Alcohol Ordinance, Ordinance # 410.05E to remove the extended hour's license fee.** Councilwoman Pugh seconded the motion.

Mayor Blankenship informed council that we had received the check for \$1,000.00 from People's Self Help Housing on the Green Street Apartments. Mayor stated that the lease will be up on June 30, 2024.

Updates:

Mayor Blankenship met with Matt Lee who works with Eaton Asphalt Paving/Brown County Construction looking at city streets for blacktop. They went over 7 city streets. Mayor stated he would like to use some of the American Rescue Plan funds that the city has received for drainage and blacktopping of city streets and would like to get council approval on this. He stated he was going to contact Mark Rigdon as he has worked on drains before and charged us a reasonable rate. Mayor Blankenship states we need to do something that we can fiscally see using the American Rescue Plan funds.

Councilman Lodge made a motion to **give Mayor Blankenship authority to make the decision on the street and drainage repairs as needed using the American Rescue Plan funds.** Councilman Jahn seconded the motion.

Mayor Blankenship stated he had spoke with Terri Johnson with Kentucky League of Cities regarding the flooding in Eastern Kentucky. Ms. Johnson has emailed him several drop off locations where they are accepting only Water and Cleaning Supplies as of right now. Trace Creek Construction has partnered with the Lewis County High School Band and Football Team to "Fill the Trailer" (band trailer) of water and cleaning supplies and Mayor Blankenship is asking if anyone would like to drop off those items here to the Municipal Building that we would make sure it gets on the trailer. Ms. Johnson also mentioned that equipment is needed

to help clean up areas that has been flooded. Mayor Blankenship would like to make available to send down any equipment or help to the areas.




